


LIVO LOGISTICS WITH MULTIMODAL TRANSPORT OF FILTER SEPARATOR SETS






FREJA HANDLE CARGO FOR NEW PLANT IN FINLAND

AFRIGUIDE HANDLES DELIVERY OF HEAT RECOVERY STEAM GENERATOR SYSTEM

Members in South Africa, Afriguide Logistics were recently entrusted with the task of delivering a 200th heat recovery steam generator system via Durban to a project site in Pretoria, North of Johannesburg.

The system comprised of 65 pieces shipped from Genoa in Italy and Mersin in Turkey to Durban for ultimate delivery to a brewery in Pretoria. The larger components were shipped as RoRo

static cargo loaded onto Mafi trailers with some of these pieces weighing in excess of 40tns and unusually shaped so specialist rigging and careful handling was required.

Director at Afriguide, Brad Stephens comments: "Since the entire system was shipped at the same time and had to be assembled on site in a specific sequence, some of the components had to be staged at an off-dock warehouse in Durban.

The project engineers would then 'call in' certain parts as and when they needed them. With expensive cranes and costly personnel on standby, the onus was on Afriguide to present the cargo onto the site promptly."

The entire inventory was delivered and erected over a period of two weeks and the end result was a resounding success.

W.I.S. ARE CHARTERING VESSELS FOR LARGE PIPES PROJECT

W.I.S. (members in Italy) are handling an ongoing project for the delivery of 35,000mtns of pipes to Tengiz in Kazakhstan.

This full chartered vessel is number 3 of an estimated total of 10-12 vessels to deliver the large quantity of pipes. The pipes are picked up in Northern Italy and transported to the Port of Loading, Chioggia in Venice before shipping to Aktau in Kazakhstan and onto the final destination of Tengiz.

The W.I.S. services included the pick-up of cargo by standard tilt and flat-bed trailers, complete handling, storage until consolidation of all cargo was completed, customs formalities, vessel agency & preparation and the provision of manpower, equipment, material and supervision for the loading, lashing, securing and dunnage of the cargo according to the strict handling instructions provided by the client. W.I.S. TRANSPORTS OOG CARGO TO KAZAKHSTAN

Last month, W.I.S. were awarded the transportation of 8 OOG items from Northern Italy to Tengiz in Kazakhstan by a major international forwarder.

The cargo of an 'exhaust stack anchorage' was handled on 4 trailers each holding 2 units with dimensions of 691 x 355 x 281cm and 691 x 358 x 274cm with the average weight per trailer at 6tns. The cargo was loaded for direct delivery with no transhipment, on routing IT/AT/DE/LV/RU/KZ and was completed in about 18 days to the final destination of Tengiz.

The W.I.S. services included the obtaining of road permits, provision of suitable low-bed trailers, export clearance and transit formalities. W.I.S. have been valued PCN members in Italy since 2010.

W.I.S. WITH OOG SHIPMENT FROM ITALY TO SOUTH KOREA

Italian members, W.I.S. have had a busy summer with many successful projects including the cargo photographed which was picked up from various origins in Northern Italy and shipped to South Korea.

The cargo was loaded at Venice Port for shipping to Busan. W.I.S. handled the following:

- Provision of road permits and suitable low-bed trailers for the collection of the OOG cargo
- Pick-up of general cargo by tilt & flat-bed trailers
- Complete handling
- Storage until consolidation of all cargo was completed

- Customs formalities
- Pick-up of empty containers
- Stuffing, blocking & bracing
- Production of suitable wooden saddles to ensure a safe & sound voyage and delivery at the final destination
- Lashing certification of cargo loaded on FR containers

The shipment was sensitive and urgently needed at the destination and due to strict handling guidelines, all lifting and securing plans and procedures were required by the client. The whole loading process involved the use of heavy lifting equipment as well as special lashing and dunnage. W.I.S. ensured the client's full satisfaction with their reliable services.

The OOG cargo was loaded onto $10 \times 40'$ and 20' FRs with details including:

FORTUNE & GEBRÜDER WEISS TRANSPORT 60TN ROTOR

Recently, Fortune International Transport (members in Italy) transported a 60th rotor in cooperation with Gebrüder Weiss (members in Austria).

The rotor was moved by road with permits and escorts from Italy to Lübeck in Germany where it was transferred onto a MAFI and shipped 1,500km by ferry to St. Petersburg in Russia before continuing by road to the final destination.

The journey totalled 1,400km by road in Europe, 1,500km by sea in the Baltic and 600km from St. Petersburg to the final destination in Russia. The rotor is photographed during the operations.

This is the second movement with the same cargo and route handled by Fortune, a year after the first. Managing Director at Fortune, Paolo Federici comments; "We have yet another similar but bigger shipment planned for Spring 2018 – stay tuned!"

KHIMJI RAMDAS DELIVER RIG & ACCESSORIES IN OMAN

Khimji Ramdas Projects & Logistics Group are members in Oman and have successfully delivered a RIG 106 carrier and mast as well as their accessories to one of the major players in the oil & gas industry.

The rig and its parts were brought to Oman from Jakarta in Indonesia on board a multi-purpose heavy lift vessel, self-geared with 4 cranes of 32m/24m outreach. After discharging at Sohar Port in Oman, the cargo was customs cleared and the OOG packages were successfully delivered to Nizwa, around 350kms away from the Port. Khimji Ramdas handled the entirety of the Oman leg, right from the discharge of the cargo until final delivery.

The rig carrier (on wheels with dimensions of $1542 \times 270 \times 310$ cm and weighing 25tns) and the rig mast (with dimensions of $1875 \times 255 \times 160$ cm and weighing 18tns) were the most critical parts, not only in terms of their size, but also due to their sensitivity to the whole package. The heaviest pieces were the 2 pipe boxes

weighing 36tns each (dimensions of $1088 \times 295 \times 125$ cm).

 3×100 tn low-beds (carrying the rig carrier and the 2 pipe boxes), 1×18 m long flat-bed (carrying the rig mast) and 6×12 m long (and 3m wide) flat-beds were used to transport the OOG components to Nizwa whilst the in-gauge components were carried in 12m flat beds. A total tally of 13 trailers were used in the whole project with the dispatching from port and the offloading operations at site handled with 100tn cranes.

Traversing the distance of 350kms, through the city limits of Sohar, Muscat and Nizwa was the main challenge of the job. However, despite all odds, the whole operation was successfully and safely completed by Khimji Ramdas within a span of just two days from customs clearance.

Khimji Ramdas would like to thank all the project stakeholders for providing this opportunity to deliver successfully, yet again. "Khimji Ramdas in Oman – providing synergy to the growth movements in Oman."

CEA PROJECT LOGISTICS DELIVER ROCK CRUSHER MACHINE IN THAILAND

CEA Project Logistics in Thailand are a well-established company, operating since 1999 and experts in project cargo and heavy lift services. They recently undertook the transportation and delivery of a 51th rock crusher machine.

The machine was transported directly from the retailer's factory in Saraburi to the client's stone quarry in Suphan Buri at a distance of 100km. A CEA prime mover was used to pull the specially fabricated trailer with the rock crusher loaded on-board as pictured above.

CEA also arranged a police escort, along with their own escort vehicles, to ensure maximum safety on the roads during transportation through the day and night. This is the first of several crushers that will be delivered by CEA throughout Thailand.

CEA WITH ETHOXYLATION PLANT PROJECT

CEA Project Logistics (members in Thailand, Myanmar, Vietnam and Laos) were recently contracted for preservation services, the installation of steel and wood supports, weighing and centre of gravity (CoG) reporting as well as the loadout of 15 modules and 3 filtration vessels for an ethoxylation plant in Pasadena, Texas in the USA.

The CEA team designed, fabricated on-site and installed temporary steel and wooden supports for over 300 valves. Each support secured every valve in position to prevent damage and stress to the pipe work and other structures during transportation.

The Project Engineer for CEA assisted by providing services for the weighing of each of the 15 modules and 3 vessels and providing detailed engineering CoG weighing reports to the clients. The preservation work was carried out for every control valve and pump on each of the modules and pipe racks to ensure protection against oxidation rust and dust from moisture and air.

For the final part of the project, CEA provided a full scope of loadout services to transport the 18 units on hydraulic trailers from the fabrication shipyard to alongside the vessel at Laem Chabang Port in Thailand. Route transport surveys were carried out beforehand and a CEA escort vehicle accompanied each convoy to ensure maximum safety during the transportation. The cargo was then readied for export and loadout was completed by the vessels on-board cranes. A professional job as always from CEA Project Logistics.





CEA HANDLE TRANSPORTATION OF LARGE CHEMICAL TANK & TRAILER

CEA Projects have recently handled the transportation of large chemical tank and trailer from Hanoi in Vietnam to Ghana.

CEA WITH MINING TRANSPORTATION TO LAOS

CEA Projects Vietnam have recently completed the transportation of a large mining excavator from Laem Chabang Port in Thailand by vessel to Vung Ang in Central Vietnam and then across the border to the mine site located 500km into Laos.

The body of the excavator measured 5.4m wide and weighed 70tns. The rest of the unit was spread over 6 trucks with each trucking carrying over 30tns.

The move was critical for the mine site and was delivered under extreme safety conditions due to the route being hit by a typhoon just two days prior to transportation which limited both the quality and width of the road.

THE "INSIGHT" ARTICLES ARE ALL GEARED TOWARDS EXPLAINING SEEMINGLY COMPLEX MATTERS IN SIMPLE TERMS.

Let me take you back in time, not just a few years but to the beginning of our universe. It is now generally accepted that our universe started with a "Big Bang" some 14 billion years ago. See Figure 1. You may wonder how scientists figured out its age. This is actually a lot less complicated than you might imagine. They found traces of matter (dust, meteors, planets, stars) that are at least 14 billion years old, and by definition if something within our universe is 14 billion years old, our universe must be at least that old. How do you know something is 14 billion years old. By looking at stars. It was established that the bigger (massive) a star is the brighter it shines. You don't have to be a rocket scientist for this. They also saw that big stars burn through their fuel a lot faster than small stars. A star 10 times the mass of the sun will burn up in about 20 million years while a star with only half the mass of the sun will burn up in 20 billion years. With the star's brightness and a tiny bit of mathematics the universe's age was established. Keep in mind that a few million years plus or minus doesn't make a big difference.

NOTE: To put this age in perspective let's assume that a 24 hour clock started ticking 14 billion (14,000,000,000) years ago when the universe started to exist.

When our ancestors started appearing some 6 million years ago, the time was 23:59:23 The modern form of humans only evolved about 200,000 years ago at 23:59:58 Since the beginning of the universe 24 hours ago, we humans have been around for the last 2 seconds.

Why is this cosmos info important for an article about heavy lifting and heavy transport. Well, the discoveries that the scientists made (mentioned in the previous article; Newton, Archimedes, Galileo etc) did not occur in a nice chronological order. Newton's laws of gravity where formulated in the 1680's although gravity is at the core of almost every scientific discovery (even discoveries made before Newton was even born) and originates from the beginning of our universe.

While the scientists where studying the planets they noticed that planets move. More importantly, they noticed that the movement is depending on other planets and/or stars being in their vicinity. As if they are being attracted like magnets. This is indeed the case. Matter in general attracts other matter in its vicinity. The more matter in the object (such as a planet) and the more dense the matter is (kg/m3) the higher the attraction. This attraction is the core force of our universe and prevents us from falling off our planet. It is called gravity.


When we stand on Earth gravity is the force that keeps our feet on the ground. Every force has a direction (we will see this in a future article), the force of gravity is no exception and is directed toward the center of our planet. Hence the expression "Center of Gravity" or CoG. This force makes sure that everything that falls, falls towards the center of Earth. See Figure 2. Every object, not just a planet, has a Center of Gravity (this we will also see in a future article) on which the gravitation force of our planet acts. You probably have experience with Center of Gravity information when shipping, lifting or transporting cargo. This CoG as indicated on the cargo is the point on which the gravity force acts. As a matter of fact, many other forces that we are dealing with in our industry act on this same CoG point as well. Think about acceleration forces and centrifugal forces (these you experience when you go around the corner), just to name a few.

NOTE: The Center of Gravity of an object (not being a planet) is sometimes called Center of Mass. It is the same point but the latter name makes more sense for objects.

There is much controversy and misunderstanding about the Center of Gravity, what it is and what it does and what it represents. Because it is so often misunderstood, it is often neglected, this is a dangerous thing to do. Not knowing where the CoG i located means not knowing how gravity will act on the object. This can have very serious consequences.

The goal of this article is to give you a better understanding of gravity and the terminology surrounding it. I believe that building up to it from the Big Bang gives you this better understanding.

The next article will explain how gravity causes and influences our tides

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





GLOGOS DELIVER WIND TURBINES TO ULYANOVSK

Glogos in Russia have recently delivered the second batch of wind turbines from Shanghai in China to the river port of Ulyanovsk. The total cargo volume amounted to 40,000ftns with the length of each blade at 54m and the height of each base at 4.85m. Glogos handled the ocean freight shipping with transshipment to river barges made in the port of Constanta (Romania). The whole project was performed in two batches – in autumn 2016, the towers of wind turbines were transported and the propellers were delivered during August 2017.

For the 'river-sea' vessels, a reinforcement deck for loading the heavy cargo was specially made. Whilst at the port of Constanta, the Glogos team organised the transshipment of the blades with a three-tiered loading system on barges, the modelling and planning of which was carried out in advance and tested in the port of Shanghai. The Project Manager, Maxim Yakovlev comments: "This arrangement allowed us to optimally place the entire cargo on only two barges and save the customer's resources".

The challenging parts of the transportation was the height of the cargo with the stool base of the package coming below the level of the loading bed and passing through the flood hit areas of Gujarat and Rajasthan.

Many LT wires had to be negotiated and for 3 HT wires, power shutdown permission had to be obtained from the local authority which was swiftly managed by the field staff without stopping the transportation.

The stool base of the package, which was below the axle bed, also required extra care during transportation because of speed breakers & turning of the axles. CAD software was used to assess the safe passage in critical turning roads and sideway obstacles. Also, due to the over-width of the package, it required the opening of sensors at three toll plazas with permission from the toll authorities to allow the cargo to move safely."

EXG once again completed the task successfully by safely delivering the job at customer's site in time.

WSS UAE WITH RETURN SHIPMENT OF RAIL WAGON VACUUM SYSTEM

OLA ARRANGE BREAKBULK SHIPMENT OF CRAWLER CRANE

OLA Groups Logistics have arranged the breakbulk shipment of a crawler crane (QUY180) with a gross weight of 359.668mt across 66 pieces.

Before loading, OLA Groups Logistics discussed and planned the project with the C/O, port captain, foreman, and lashing workers to ensure the safe and proper stowage, dunnage, lashing and securing of the cargo.

The main engine and other pieces were transported to the shipside by trailer with the main engine directly loaded by two ship cranes with two lengths of steel lifting lines and the other cargo loaded by one of the ship cranes or a shore crane.

FORTUNE INTL & EUROPE CARGO COOPERATING ON PIPE PROJECT

Fortune International Transport (members in Italy) and Europe Cargo (members in Belgium) are cooperating on a pipe shipment from Antwerp to Bandar Abbas.

Fortune took care of the freight negotiations with the shipping line, while Europe Cargo handled the loading operations. The first lot (photographed below) consisted of 600tns of special pipes measuring over 22m long and a similar lot will be moved in one months' time.

The special pipes had a lot of specific handling instructions from the shipper which had to be carefully followed including:

- Top stowage
- Not to be handled or loaded during rain
- No forklift handling. To be handled with an 18m spreader and to be lifted with pre-slungs on the bundles
- Bundles to be covered with plastic sheeting once in cargo hold
- Coverage at all time including storage
- Loading by bundles and not by mega-bundles inside vessel
- A maximum stack height of 2m to avoid stowing them in one side all the way to the top
- The first tier of bundles needs to be on a flat surface with a minimum of 16 wooden planks equally spread
- Vertical planks secured on each side equally spread – 6 pieces each side
- Minimum space aft/fwd of 50cm to be left for safe handling
